

ADASS launch new Springboard leadership development programme, in association with Tunstall Healthcare

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The modular programme, designed for Adult Principal Social Workers, aims to identify and help develop the next generation of adult social care leaders, supporting participants in developing their impact and influence, and full leadership potential.

Twelve successful candidates across England's nine regions will be selected.
